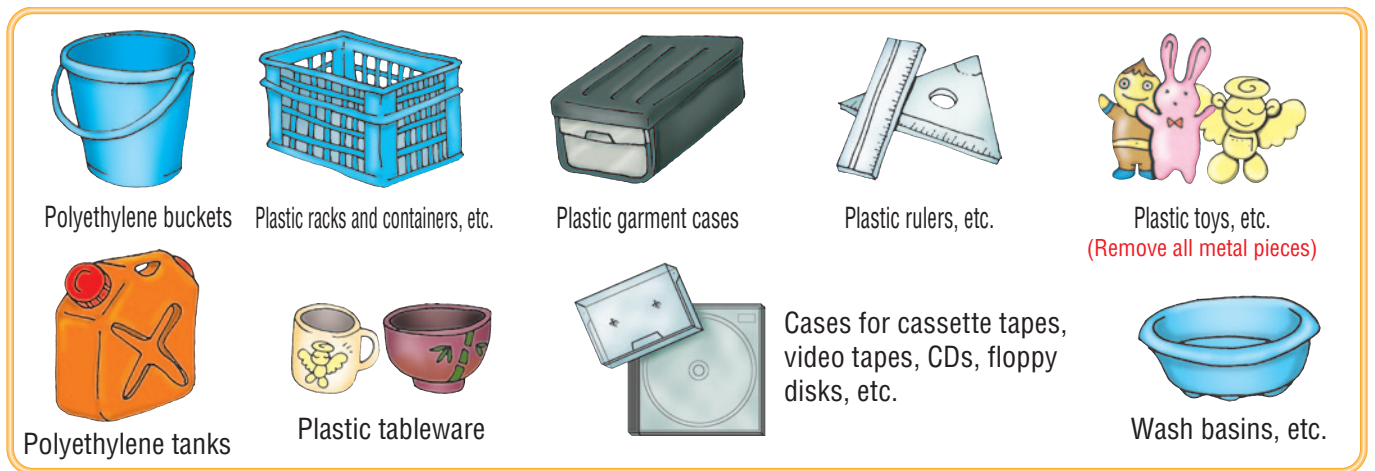


## (2) Other Plastic Garbage

<p><b>How to Sort</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>① Plastic garbage excluding plastic containers and packaging belong to this category.</li> <li>② <b>Plastic items used mainly as tools</b>, such as polyethylene buckets, wash basins, garment cases, etc.</li> <li>③ <b>Metal parts</b> such as screws and nuts <b>should be removed</b> from plastic toys, riding toys, etc. (<b>* Items made of both plastic and metal parts that cannot be dismantled should be disposed as landfill waste.</b>)</li> <li>④ Cases for CDs, video tapes, cassette tapes, floppy disks, etc. (<b>* Plastic items with magnets inside are landfill waste</b>)</li> <li>⑤ Vinyl and rubber hoses are landfill waste.</li> </ol>
<p><b>How to Dispose</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>① Write your ward, section, and name on a town-designated garbage bag and tie at top to close.</li> <li>② Small items should be placed in a bag. If an item is too large to fit into a bag, write your name on the item and place out as it is.</li> <li>③ Empty planters, plastic flower pots, etc. of dirt and rinse with water.</li> <li>④ Rinse lightly with water and clean all items as needed.</li> </ol>
